Workshop Abstracts	
A	The first paper explores how the British news media linguistically represents dementia. The second considers the framing of dementia in society. This session will be chaired by Prof Kevin Harvey.
B	A sore mouth is a source of discomfort and may make eating difficult. Normally we look after our own mouths, but people with dementia may lose the ability, and resent or resist when others try to help. Mouthcare Matters is a national programme offering tips and support.
C	Dementia affects communication and understanding. The way we say things makes it easier or harder to be misinterpreted. This session provides some practical hints and hands on learning, led by a speech and language therapist and a nurse.
D	People with dementia may call out repetitively, making the environment difficult for other patients, residents and staff and sometimes drawing criticism from regulators and visitors if the calling out is not attended to. Staff know about the theory of unmet needs causing such behaviours, but how to use this effectively in practice is less sure. We will share experiences, reflect on research, and try to develop plans for action
